Improve utilization of integrated Maternal, Newborn, Child Health, Family Planning and Nutrition (MNCH/FP/N) services.

Objectives

Increase availability and quality of high impact interventions through strengthening district level local management and health system.

The Project Approach

MaMoni HSS focuses on strengthening the systems and standards for maternal, newborn, child health, family planning and nutrition (MNCH/FP/N) that will result in declines in maternal, newborn and child mortality at scale.

The project's inputs are aligned to improve performance and capacity of the district health systems which in turn ensures that interventions result in increased access to and utilization of services by the most vulnerable.


